The editorial correction, which was made by NIST pursuant to its authority under § 10.12 of Department procedures, affects § 5.1 and was made to improve the clarity of this section and to read as follows:

§ 5.1 Rough size—The minimum rough thickness of dry or unseasoned lumber 1 or more inches in nominal thickness shall be not less than  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch (3 mm) thicker than the corresponding minimum dressed thickness, except that up to 20 percent of a shipment shall be not less than  $\frac{3}{32}$  inch (2 mm) thicker than the corresponding minimum dressed thickness. The minimum rough widths shall not be less than  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch (3 mm) wider than the corresponding minimum dressed width.

That directive concerns imports of certain cotton, wool, man-made fiber, silk blend and other vegetable fiber textile products, produced or manufactured in the People's Republic of China and exported during the twelve-month period which began on January 1, 1996 and extends through December 31, 1996.
